<u>iPhone Camera Basics</u> 9/19/23



<u>Turn ON in Settings - (Scroll to Camera in Settings)</u>

- Use Volume Up for Burst (more on Burst mode below)
- Scan QR codes
- Grid (Great for Photography Rule of Thirds)

Turn OFF in Settings - (Scroll to Camera in Settings)

- Mirror Front Camera (photos will not show printed information backwards)
- View Outside the Frame

Open Your Camera (5 ways):

- Swipe left on the Lock Screen
- From the Lock Screen click on the Camera icon (Lower right-hand side of screen)
- Use the camera icon on your home screen to open the camera (easier to find if placed on the Dock)
- From Control Center click on the Camera App
- Ask Siri to open the camera

Taking a Photo (3 ways)

- Click on the shutter in the open Camera app
- Press either the up or down volume buttons when the Camera app is open
- If you have an Apple Watch, click on the Camera app.

NOTE: THE LAST PHOTO/VIDEO YOU TOOK CAN BE SEEN IN THE SMALL PREVIEW BOX TO THE LEFT OF THE SHUTTER.

Camera Features:

Burst Photos (Great for action shots)

- 1) If turned on in Camera settings, hold the up Volume button as long as you want the action photographed or
- 2) To view the Burst photos go to the Photos app and click on Albums. Scroll to Bursts and click on. Choose the Burst photo out the Bursts album and click on. Click on Select at the bottom on the screen to view all of the burst photos and choose which photos you would like to save.

Time-Lapse

To take best time-lapse photos use a tripod or prop phone, have a full battery and turn off notifications to keep phone steady

· Slo-Mo

Slows down and smooths your video

Video

Record video by holding red shutter (move to right to lock it on) or use either Volume button by holding one of them down.

Easy to switch from Photo to Video. Touch and hold shutter to start video. To keep recording drag to locked position.

Taking a photo while taking a video: touch and hold shutter moving it to the right where an additional white shutter appears. Click white shutter to take a photo

Details below in Photo Features

Portrait

Blurs background and sharpens face

Cinematic

Apply a depth-of-field effect to your videos (on supported models)

Pano

The panorama is a wide shot. It stitches together several images to form a panoramle photo.

PHOTO FEATURES


Above the viewing frame (from left to right), are located the Flash (which you can turn on or off),

Gently swipe up on photo screen or click on the down arrow to see more features)

- Flash choices Flash Auto, On, or Off
- Live Photo (takes a short video of your photo and allows you to capture the right moment)
- 4.3, Square, 16.9 for photo sizing
- +/- to change exposure
- Timer 3s or 10s (allows you to be in photo too)
- Three circles changes colorization of photo
- RAW a file format for uncompressed digital images that gives you the flexibility to do more with the photo
- Quickly adjust focus and exposure by tapping your screen

Editing your Photos **AFTER** taking the photo: The last photo you take can be accessed on the bottom left hand corner of your camera screen or go to PHOTOS app for complete library.

 In your PHOTOS app indicates there is

- All editing tools above can be used to enhance or photo such as saturation, cropping, straightening, etc.
- Live Photo (1 second video of your photo) instructions: On your photo tap Edit, tap LIVE icon, drag frame, tap Make Key Photo

Delete Duplicate Photos

Go to ALBUMS at the bottom of the Photos app. Scroll down to Utilities and click on DUPLICATES (will only be there if there are duplicate photos in your library). Merge duplicate photos.

Erasing the Background of a Photo

Go to Photos and click on one you took. Press and hold the image until a white glow appears around it. Click Copy or Share and insert in a message or document.
